## What the task forces are up to...

**Priority 6: Increase HPV vaccination rates.** *Chaired by Stacie Fredenburg*

-The task force is working to develop its action plan for 2015-2016. Additionally, the task force is providing support to the newly awarded HPV implementation grantee: Sanford Health. Contact [Stacie](#) to participate.

**Priority 7: Increase risk-appropriate screening for breast cancer.** *Chaired by Mary Kolsrud*

-The task force is working to develop its action plan for 2015-2016. Recently, the task force assisted Komen SD to apply for a Komen Coalition Building Grant. The focus of the application is on increasing provider knowledge of screening guidelines and utilization of client reminders. Contact [Mary](#) to join.

**Priority 9: Increase risk-appropriate screening for colorectal cancer.** *Chaired by Jill Ireland*

-The task force is working to develop its action plan for 2015-2016. A forum focused on the 80% by 2018 initiative and increased partnerships with FQHCs to increase colorectal cancer screening rates is being held in Atlanta, GA in September 2015. The South Dakota team applied and was selected to participate. The application process was quite competitive as there were 34 applications for 11 spots. Contact [Jill](#) to join.

**Priority 12: Increase participation in cancer clinical trials.** *Co-Chaired by Charlene Berke and Lora Black*

-The task force is working to complete the clinical trials partnership project with USD that was awarded to the treatment workgroup. The provider portion of the videos were recently recorded and the patient recording is scheduled. Contact [Charlene](#) or [Lora](#) to get involved.

**Priority 14: Improve availability of palliative and end-of-life care services.** *Chaired by Lexi Haux*

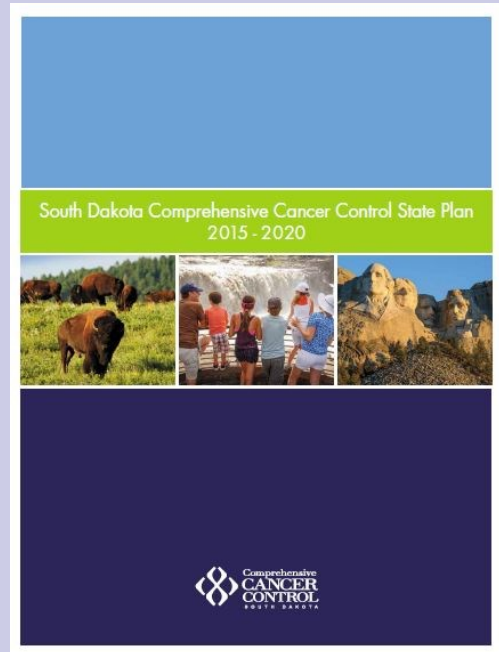

## Spotlight On...the South Dakota Comprehensive Cancer Control State Plan 2015-2020

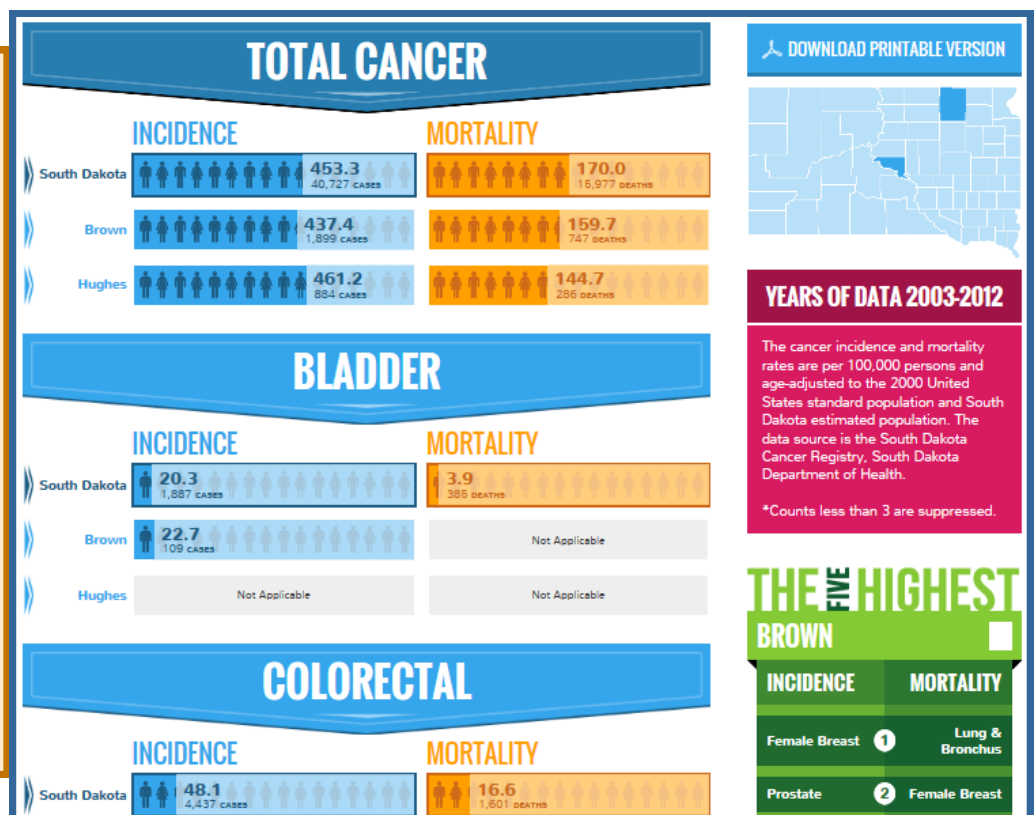

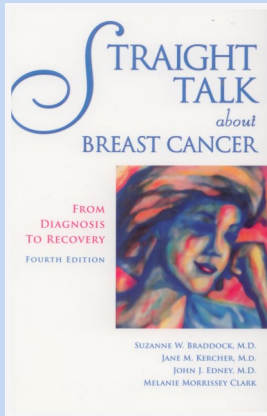
