**Chief Cancer Control Officer**  
**American Cancer Society, Inc.**

Richard C. Wender, MD, chief cancer control officer of the American Cancer Society, helps lead the only comprehensive cancer control organization in the world. He drives the effort to transform the face of cancer here and around the globe by developing strategies for access to care, patient navigation, and health equity.

Prior to joining the Society's staff in 2013, he provided extensive volunteer leadership at the organization's state and local levels. In 2006, he was elected national president of the Society, becoming the first primary care physician to serve in this capacity.

Dr. Wender worked for more than three decades as a family physician in the department of family and community medicine at Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia. From 2002 until 2013, he served as alumni professor and chair of the department.

Dr. Wender has led numerous initiatives designed to improve preventive care and chronic disease management. He currently serves as chair of the National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable

Dr. Nekhlyudov is an Associate Professor at Harvard Medical School as well as a Medical Director and practicing internist at the Brigham & Women's Hospital Primary Care Associates, Longwood. She is Clinical Director, Internal Medicine for Cancer Survivors at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute, offering clinical consultations for long term cancer survivors at the David B. Perini Quality of Life Clinic and the Adult Survivorship Program. Dr. Nekhlyudov is particularly interested in improving the care of cancer survivors and the interplay between primary and oncology care.

Dr. Nekhlyudov has served on several American Society of Clinical Oncology Committees and Task Forces, the Institute of Medicine committee to improve the quality of cancer care and is a member of the National Comprehensive Cancer Network Guideline Committee. She is currently a National Cancer Institute-Academy Health Visiting Scholar. Dr. Nekhlyudov is co-Director of the Dana Farber Cancer Institute Continuing Medical Education Program on cancer survivorship.

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
