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Introduction



Each year, thousands of children are diagnosed with cancers such as leukemia, brain tumors, and lymphomas, requiring complex, long-term care that extends beyond medical treatment alone. Families often face emotional, financial, and logistical challenges, including traveling long distances for specialized care, coordinating with multiple providers, and navigating school and social disruptions.

In a largely rural state like South Dakota, these challenges can be amplified. Access to pediatric oncology services may require travel to regional centers, and families may experience barriers related to transportation, lodging, financial strain, and limited local support services.

Recognizing these challenges, the Survivorship Task Force of the South Dakota Cancer Coalition acknowledged the critical need for a centralized, easy-to-use resource that connects families, caregivers, and professionals with the services and support systems available across South Dakota. This includes financial assistance and scholarships; medication assistance; education through websites, videos, and books; events and camps; programs and wishes; nutrition; housing, transportation, and travel; support groups; and bereavement resources.

The South Dakota Childhood Cancer Resource Guide was developed to support children diagnosed with cancer and the families and professionals who care for them. Its purpose is to serve as a comprehensive, accessible tool that helps users quickly identify and connect with the resources they need throughout the cancer journey, from diagnosis and treatment to survivorship.

By organizing resources in a clear and practical way, this guide aims to reduce the burden on families, improve coordination of care, and ensure that no child or family in South Dakota has to navigate a cancer diagnosis alone. Whether you are newly navigating a diagnosis or seeking ongoing support, this guide is intended to be a trusted companion, helping you find information, connect with support, and move forward with confidence.
